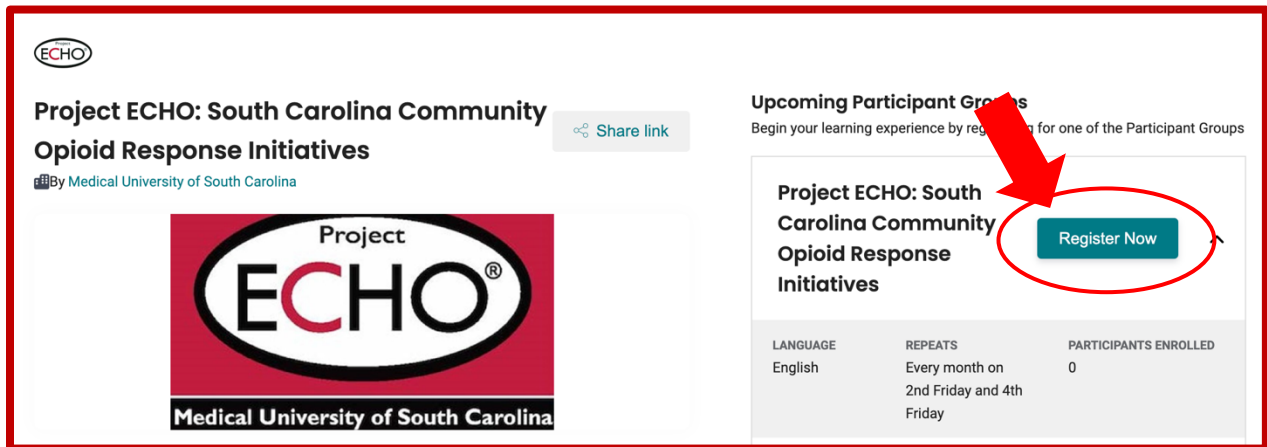


## Project ECHO: South Carolina Community Opioid Response Initiatives (CORI)
