- A. Allow us to introduce ourselves... At the Center, we are dedicated to a "South Carolina for South Carolina" mentality let's use the expertise and experience we have right here in our state to share best practices and learn alongside one another. To that end, the Center of Excellence in Addiction is a collaboration among five South Carolina entities: Clemson University, the Medical University of South Carolina, the University of South Carolina, the Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services, and the Department of Health and Environmental Control.
